Day 1, Arrive Hobart (D)

Welcome to Tasmania! Enroute to our hotel we enjoy some sightseeing at nearby Rosny Lookout before crossing the Tasman Bridge for a short tour of historic Battery Point, Salamanca Place and the vibrant waterfront before checking into our accommodation. Get to know your fellow travellers at tonight's Welcome Dinner.
Accommodation: Ibis Styles Hobart or similar (1 night)

*Please do not book any flights prior to speaking with Solo Connections or your travel agent. There will only be one group arrival & departure transfer provided, in conjunction with our Tour host flight times.

Day 2, Hobart – Strahan (B-D)

This morning we travel journey the Derwent Valley to Strahan. Along the way see Tarraleah Gorge, site of an early Hydro-electric Power Station. We'll visit "The Wall in The Wilderness" and take walk into the delightful Nelson Falls. Crossing Lake Burbury we descend into the copper mining town of Queenstown for a short tour before arriving in Strahan, situated on the magnificent Macquarie Harbour. *Accommodation: Strahan Village or similar (2 nights)*

Day 3, Strahan (B-L-D)

Today we embark on a full day cruise of the incomparable Gordon River into the heart of Tasmania's wilderness and the edge of World Heritage, including Sarah Island. Voyage to Hell's Gates, the aptly named harbour entrance where many early ships were destroyed by ferocious ocean swells. On return to Strahan explore the village including the visitor centre and Huon pine saw mill.

Day 4, Strahan – Stanley (B-L-D)

Departing from Strahan we travel the iconic Cradle Mountain National Park. Explore the park with a guided bus tour to Dove Lake and visit Waldheim, the forest home of pioneer Gustav Weindorfer. Afterwards, recharge with a delightful meal at the charming Cradle Mountain Hotel and time at the Wilderness Gallery. Continuing on, admire the evocative out-door art gallery of impressive murals in Sheffield before arriving in the quaint seaside town of Stanley.
Accommodation: Stanley Seaview Inn or similar (2 Nights)

Day 5, Stanley (B-L-D)

Today we discover the Tarkine Wilderness area and enjoy a picnic lunch returning to explore the historic village of Stanley nestling at the foot of an ancient volcanic core known as 'The Nut'. Chairlift access to the top of The Nut is optional and at own expense

Day 6, Stanley – Launceston (B-L-D)

Travelling back along the coast to the picturesque coastal town of Penguin, be sure to have a photo taken with the giant penguin before we continue to Christmas Hills Raspberry Farm for a delicious lunch. Afterwards, we continue through to the Western Tiers Distillery at Westbury for a short stop enroute to Launceston. *Accommodation: Hotel Grand Chancellor or similar (3 nights)*

Day 7, Launceston (B-L-D)

This morning visit the World Heritage Woolmers Estate, and their outstanding Rose Garden. Next we travel to the Tasmanian Gourmet Sauce Company and enjoy their gourmet BBQ lunch together with the range of sauces and preserves. Visit the nearby village of Evandale before returning to the hotel mid-afternoon for some time at leisure.

Day 8, Launceston (B-D)

We visit the beautiful Cataract Gorge this morning with its cliff-side gardens, peacocks, suspension foot bridge and one of the longest single span chairlifts in the world (ride is optional and at own expense). The afternoon is free for you to relax or explore Launceston further.

Day 9, Launceston – St Helen's (B-D)

We drive through the picturesque Tamar Valley this morning as we travel to the mine and heritage centre in the gold mining town of Beaconsfield. Cross the unique A-frame Batman Bridge and tour the north east to the coastal town of Bridport before our visit to Legerwood and the War Memorial Tree Carvings. Descending to the East Coast we arrive into at St. Helens.
Accommodation: Hotel Panorama or similar (1 night)

Day 10, St Helen's – Bicheno (B-D)

We start the day visiting Binalong Bay, situated on the edge of the Bay of Fires, before travelling the Great Eastern Drive beside the Tasman Sea, stopping off at East Coast Nature World to meet a Tasmanian devil and other unique Australian animals. We continue to the town of Bicheno to tour the Gulch Fishing Harbour and view the natural wonder of the Blowhole. This evening there is an option to enjoy a guided penguin tour (additional expense). Please note, due to the time of year, it is the "off season" where penguin numbers are minimal. During that time penguins are usually out at sea fishing or hiding themselves away as they moult. If you are still interested in doing this, you will need to advise reservations at the time of making your tour booking.
Accommodation: Beachfront Bicheno or similar (1 night)

Day 11, Bicheno – Port Arthur (B-L-D)

Visiting the pristine Freycinet Peninsula and National Park, spend some time exploring the Visitor Centre and wandering Richardson's Beach for views of the pink granite Hazards mountain range. We then travel the Great Eastern Drive via the convict built Spiky Bridge before continuing on to Port Arthur. *Accommodation: Fox and Hounds Historic Hotel or similar (2 nights)*

Day 12, Port Arthur (B-D)

Today we explore Port Arthur Convict Settlement with a guided walking tour, a short Harbour Cruise and access to the Visitor Centre and Interpretation Gallery as well as more than 30 buildings, ruins and restored gardens and houses. Afterwards, a short drive provides a chance to enjoy an accessible walk to the large viewing platform for exceptional views. The energetic can descend 115 steps to the Remarkable Cave and the custom-designed platform at the base.

Day 13, Port Arthur – Hobart (B-D)

Travel to the nearby Port Arthur Lavender Farm followed by The Tasmanian Chocolate Foundry before driving to the historic town of Richmond to view the spire of Australia's oldest Catholic Church from beneath the arch of Australia's oldest stone bridge still in use. Afterwards, we travel to the city of Hobart. *Accommodation: The Old Woolstore or similar (3 nights)*

Day 14, Huon Valley (B)

Today take in the panoramic views of the city and estuary from Mt Nelson before travelling along the Derwent River which broadens into the D'Entrecasteaux Channel. We stop at Crawleighwood Garden and then travel to Huonville and the apple orchards of the Huon Valley and a visit to Willie Smith's Apple Shed.

Day 15, Leisure Time -Salamanca Markets (B-D)

Today explore the famous Salamanca open-air Markets and weather permitting we may tour Mt. Wellington for panoramic views of the city and estuary. Afterwards, we will have some free time in Hobart's city centre.

Day 16, Depart Hobart (B-MT)

This morning we take in the landscaped grounds of the Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens and enjoy morning tea at a local cafe before travelling the short distance to Hobart Airport where we say goodbye and board our flights home.
