### **Day 1, Brisbane–Norfolk Island (D)**

We will meet our Tour Host and fellow travellers at Brisbane International Airport for our flight to Norfolk Island. On arrival we will be transferred to our centrally located hotel. There will be a little bit of time to freshen up. This evening, we'll indulge in a hearty Barney Duffy BBQ feast. We'll be joined by local guest speakers as they share memorabilia, stories, and insights into the Island's history. After dinner, we embark on the Wonderland by Night tour and then return to 'the shed' for a delicious dessert. *Hotel: Aloha Apartments (7 Nights)*

### **Day 2, Norfolk Island (B,D)**

Enjoy breakfast before a Morning Island Orientation Tour, introducing us to the island's history and life as it is today. We will also enjoy time at the local craft markets. After lunch, (at own expense), we will be taken on the Women of Norfolk tour. There will be free time in the afternoon before we are collected for a very unique experience. We step inside the historic St Barnabas Chapel for In the Sweet By and By, a 90minute musical tribute where rare archival recordings, expert commentary, and a live organ recital combine in one of the South Pacific's most beautiful sacred spaces. We then continue to this evening's Progressive Dinner, a 3-course meal progressing to different Norfolk Island family homes throughout the evening. This is a fun night and a great way to meet the local people.



### **Day 3, Norfolk Island (B,D)**

An early start today sees us taking an optional, leisurely Breakfast Bushwalk through the National Park. At the end of the walk, we meet on the clifftop for a delicious breakfast barbeque. We return mid-morning and have some free time. In the afternoon we take The Taste of Norfolk tour. Late afternoon we will be collected and transferred to this evening's Island Fish Fry. Enjoy the stunning cliff top scenery and feast of Island dishes, along with local entertainment and the sunset.

### **Day 4, Norfolk Island (B,D)**

Following breakfast is our Norfolk Today tour. We will learn how Norfolk Islanders live in the 21st Century and the essential services that make life on a tiny South Pacific island possible. We are taken to Fitzzy's Lavender Farm for an informative talk on the journey to setting up Norfolk Islands first ever Lavender Farm. In the evening, we have a Night as Convict Dinner. Tonight is sure to be a fun time as we dress\* like convicts and join in with the Commandant for an evening of gaiety, feasting, singing & dancing. \*convict outfit supplied.

### **FOUNDATION DAY**

### **Day 5, Norfolk Island (B,L)**

Today is Foundation Day and is celebrated every year on the 6th March to commemorate the day on which Lt. Philip Gidley King arrived on the island in 1788, establishing the very first European settlement there. He left Port Jackson earlier that year on the HMAS Supply along with 22 people, 15 of whom were convicts. Following breakfast this morning we are taken to Kingston, to enjoy a re-enactment of the first landing on Norfolk Island in the annual Foundation Day celebrations. This is then followed by a sumptuous lunch of traditional Island fare and local entertainment. This evening dinner is at our own expense however we will have a reservation at the Bowling Club Bar & Bistro, one of Norfolk's most popular places which is just a short stroll next door, for anyone that would like to join.

### **Day 6, Norfolk Island (B,D)**

After a leisurely breakfast we make a visit to Fletchers Mutiny Cyclorama, a continuous 360degree panoramic painting that tells the story of the mutiny on the Bounty. This will be followed by a stroll through Queen Victoria's Garden after which you may choose to walk back into town or take the short bus ride back. Later today we will be taken to Kingston, for the Convict History Tour, an in-depth tour of the historic Georgian settlement of Kingston. Early evening we will be transferred to Hilli Restaurant for tonight's dinner.

### **Day 7, Norfolk Island (B,L,D)**

Enjoy breakfast before we join the Paddock to Plate tour. On this tour, we'll visit a market garden that supplies vegetables to the Island and learn about providing seasonal produce. We'll also tour a farm with beef cattle to understand the unique farming practices on Norfolk Island. Next, we'll visit a free-range chicken farm and learn how they supply the Island with farm fresh eggs. Our final stop will be at a local home for a delicious two-course lunch featuring local ingredients. We return and have the afternoon at leisure. For our last night together, this evening we go back in time to 1859 on Norfolk Island and dine with the chief magistrate Frederick Young and his Wife Mary. Whilst enjoying a 3 Course dinner we'll help solve the mystery of "Who killed the Surveyor?"

### **Day 8, Norfolk Island–Brisbane (B)**

Enjoy breakfast this morning before we check out and are then taken on an exclusive guided tour to the home of world-renowned author, the late Colleen McCullough, who made Norfolk Island her home in 1979. Sadly our time in this remote paradise is coming to a close and upon returning to our accommodation we will need to meet in the transit lounge before we are transferred to the Norfolk Island airport to check in for our return flight to Brisbane. \*Please note: Itinerary is subject to change
